Liz will continue to maintain the WCAA website as she formulates strategies to bring the arts alive in a way that will benefit the artists and the community. She looks forward to developing relationships with the membership in her new capacity as Volunteer Coordinator and to expanding the arts offerings in the area by means of grant funding, aided by grant consultant, Tamara Murray.

## **WCAA BUILDS PARTNERSHIP WITH AREA SCHOOLS**

Beginning in January 2006 the Wayne County Arts Alliance will be presenting three, fifty-dollar *Fine Arts Student of the Month Awards* to outstanding students from Wallenpaupack, Western Wayne, and Wayne Highlands school districts each month. Students will be recommended for the awards by their teachers.

At a recent board meeting, Peter Paulicks, a Honesdale High School instrumental music instructor, and Lori Gearhart, Fine Arts Faculty Department Chairman at Wallenpaupack Area High School, presented the ideas that faculty at the three schools had discussed in reply to the WCAA's suggestion that an organization outside of the school district sponsor an award to recognize students' accomplishments in the arts.

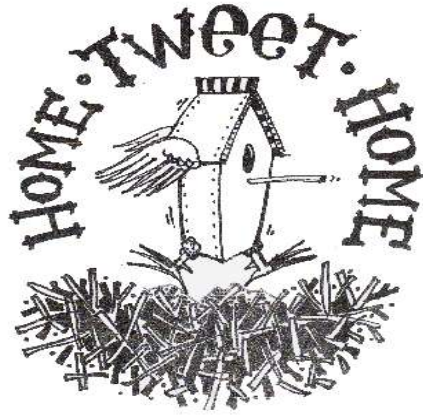
The board, agreeing that the program was in step with the mission of the WCAA to encourage and promote the arts in Wayne County, approved funding for the awards through May 2007.

## ***WAYNE MEMORIAL HOSPITAL TO HOST ROTATING ART EXHIBIT OF REGIONAL ARTISTS***

Soon artists will have a chance to participate in a rotating art exhibit at the Wayne Memorial Hospital in Honesdale. Agreeing that their common mission is to "...enhance and support their community by uplifting and inspiring lives through the color, shapes, and images of artists and the healing hands and hearts of healthcare workers," Wayne Memorial Hospital and the Wayne County Arts Alliance have signed a twelve-month agreement to allow area artists, who are members of the WCAA, to display their work in the new wing of the hospital. The exhibits will be changed at four-month intervals.

The idea of an art exhibit in the hospital has been in talks for months while details were being ironed out. Selection criteria are based on a set of standards that speak to practical purposes such as space, artistic elements representing an influential movement, genre, or national culture, and content that is consistent with the mission of Wayne Memorial Hospital.

***Are you ready for the summer buzzzzzz?*** No, not the bees, but the birdhouses that will populate Wayne County! The WCAA fun....draiser this year will be very visible, very large birdhouses on poles that will be on display all summer at local business sites.

The decorated deer of ***Wayne Deer Games*** kicked off our first season, the Adirondack chairs we called ***County Seats*** were everyone's favorites, and now we are ready to flock to our third venture – giant birdhouses. ***Home Tweet Home*** will be a great marriage of creativity and functionality! The artists get a wonderful “canvas” in the form of a 2-foot high birdhouse. Two different types of birdhouses are available to participating artists. Artists may also elect to design a birdhouse from scratch.

Although we are leaving the decoration up to the artist, we do ask that the pieces be made weather-resistant so they can serve their intended use outdoors. Each birdhouse will be attached to a pole and planted in a 5-gallon bucket for summer display.

This year Sloane Creech, a high school student, will be helping Ellen coordinate the event. One thing she will be doing is calling artists who've participated in past events. 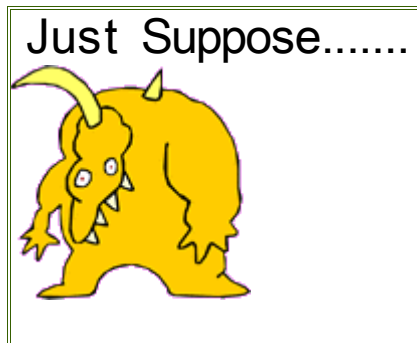
